Optional Donation for Aquatic Invasive Species Reserve

The invasive species reserve fund is for prevention and treatment of aquatic invasive species (AIS). To date, we do not have AIS on Windigo and we have been able to fund for our boat landing monitoring from volunteer hours combined with a series of grants that we have been able to access from the DNR. If AIS were found in Windigo, remediation efforts would need to be done quickly, so we are building this fund for this purpose.

Optional Donation for Fishery Management Fund

The Fish and Wildlife Committee is looking to expand its role in protecting and keeping the Windigo Lake fishery healthy. The increased fishing pressure in the last few years is putting a considerable strain on our fish and wildlife resources. With this in mind, we have made good progress with the WDNR, implementing a tree drop around the islands and have procured the permit for a few other habitat improvements. These improvements are very basic and cost effective, and although our labor and time is free, we would like to increase the funds available to us so we can implement various projects that will benefit all of the property owners. Just for example, the cabling of the trees (steel cable clamped on the stump and the fallen tree) is \$600 in material costs alone. Other projects include purchasing cinder blocks for brush habitat, pallet structures and other basic fish structures. Please consider donating, it is something that affects all of us who live on this wonderful lake. Thanks for your consideration.
